Asian Americans & Cancer


- Cancer is the leading cause of death for AA
- Language barriers
- Cancer stigma
 - Prevents people from sharing, receiving support
 - Promotes loneliness, isolation

Evaluation of Chinese Women Cancer Support Group (2011, n=18)

Self-reported change after participating 6 months


- 89% Improved self-esteem
- 84% Improved emotional management skills
- 83% No longer felt isolated
- 83% Improved outlook on life
- 90% Improved stress management skills
